

Morning Splash: 84" x 100"

Border Fabric (Purple) (2-1/2 yards)

3 – 2-1/2" strips (A)

1 – 2-1/2" strip (H)

1 – 2-7/8" strip. Cut into 14 – 2-7/8" squares (R)

1 – 3-1/4" strip. Cut 1 – 3-1/4" square (T) Save the rest of the strip. We'll use it later.

1 – 2-7/8" strip. Cut into 5 – 2-7/8" squares (W)

4 – 2" strips (B-1)

3 – 1-3/4" strips (B-2)

9 – 1-1/2" strips (B-5)

10 – 4-1/2" strips (B-9)

Background (3-5/8 yards)

3 – 1-1/2" strips (B)

2 – 2-1/2" strips (C)

12 – 2" strips (K)

6 – 4-1/2" strips. Cut into 48 – 4-1/2" squares (N)

2 – 1-1/2" strips. Cut into 28 – 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles (Q)

6 – 5" strips. Cut into 36 – 5" squares (W)

9 – 2-1/2" strips (B-7)

Accent (Black) (3 yards)

2 – 1-1/2" strips (D)

Cut 9 – 1-1/2" strips. Cut into:

- 34 – 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles (E)
- 6 – 1-1/2" strips. Cut into:
 - 34 – 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles (F)
 - 10 – 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles (Z)

1 – 1-1/2" strip (I)

1 – 1-7/8" strip. Cut into 14 – 1-7/8" squares (P)

4 – 1-1/2" strips. Cut into 28 – 1-1/2" x 5" rectangles (S)

2 – 1-1/2" strip. Cut into 14 – 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" strips (U)

7 – 1-1/2" strips (Y)

7 – 1-1/2" strips (B-3)

9 – 1-1/2" strips (B-4)

9 – 1-1/2" strips (B-6)

10 – 1-1/2" strips (B-8)

Gold (1/2 yard) (See note)

1 – 1-1/2" strip (G)

1 – 2-1/2" strip (J)

2 – 4-1/2" strips. Cut into 12 – 4-1/2" squares (O)

Note: I added gold in my flying geese border. If you want to use some gold flying geese, you'll need an extra 9-1/4" of gold fabric.

Colored Fabrics (Each of 4) (3/4 yard)

2 – 1-1/2" strips (L)

1 – 2-7/8" strip. Cut into 12 – 2-7/8" squares (M)

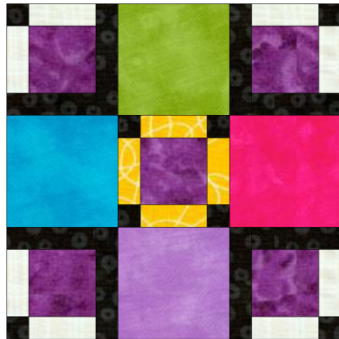
1 – 9-1/4" strip. Cut this into:

- 2 – 9-1/4" squares. Cut these on the diagonal twice so you have 8 triangles (X)
- 8 – 4-1/2" squares (V) (SEE NOTE BELOW)

NOTE: Before cutting the 2nd 4-1/2" strip – depending on the width of your fabric, you may be able to get 10 squares from the remainder of the 9-1/4" strip above. If so, you will only need to cut 1 strip instead of 2 (below).

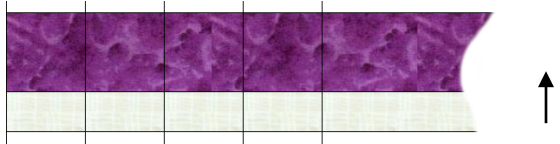
1 – 4-1/2" strip. Cut into 4 – 4-1/2" squares and add to the "V" squares for a total of 12 (V)

Block 1:



Make 6

1. Sew a 2-1/2" purple strip (A) to a 1-1/2" background strip (B). Make 3 strip sets. Cut into 34 – 2-1/2" segments.



2. Sew a 2-1/2" background strip (C) to a 1-1/2" black strip (D). Make 2 strip sets. Cut into 34 – 1-1/2" segments.



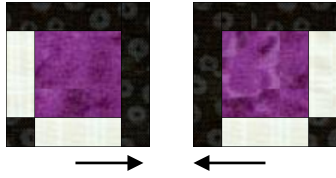
3. Sew a segment from Step 2 to a segment from Step 1. Make 34.



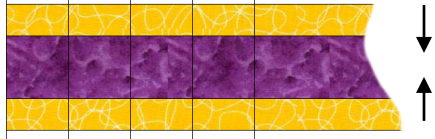
4. Sew a 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" black strip (E) to the top of the Step 3 unit. Make 12 of each of the units shown on the left. Make 22 of the units shown on the right.



5. Add a 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" black strip (F) to the side as shown below. Make 12 of the units on the left and 22 of the units on the right. Set aside 10 of the 22 units to be used in the setting triangles. 12 of each will be used in the blocks.



6. Sew a 1-1/2" gold strip (G) to the top and bottom of a 2-1/2" purple strip (H). Make 1/2 strip set. Cut into 6 - 2-1/2" segments.



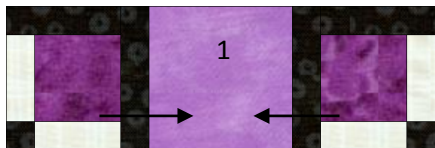
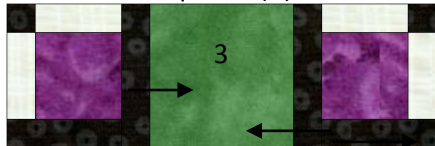
7. Sew a 1-1/2" black strip (I) to the top and bottom of a gold 2-1/2" strip (J). Make 1/2 strip set. Cut into 12 - 1-1/2" segments.



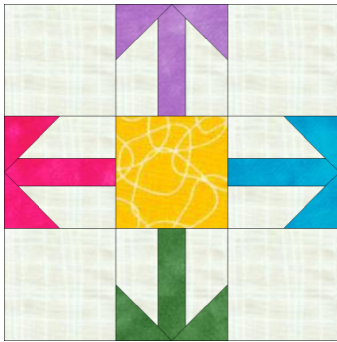
8. Sew a segment from Step 7 to two opposite sides of the units from Step 6. Make 6.



9. Assemble the block, using segments from Steps 5 and 8, together with one (per block) of each of the four colored squares (V).



Block 2:

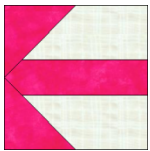
10. Sew a 2" background strip (K) to the top and bottom of a 1-1/2" colored strip (L). Make 1-1/2 strip sets of each of the four colors. Cut each colored group into 12 – 4-1/2" segments (you will have 12 segments for each of the four colors).



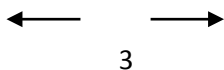
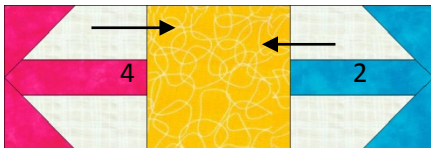
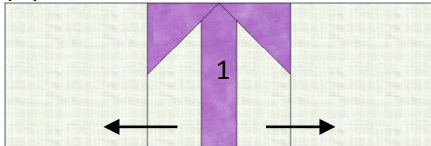
11. Mark the center of one end of the colored strip.



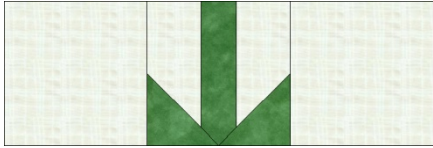
12. Using the matching color, cut the 2-7/8" squares (M) on the diagonal once and position over the ends of the segments from Step 11 to create the segment shown below. Make 12 of each color.



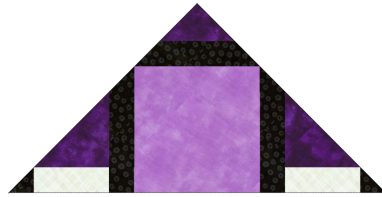
13. Assemble the block, using the segments, 4-1/2" background squares (N) and a 4-1/2" gold square (O):

Corner Triangles:



1. Cut the 1-7/8" black squares (P) on the diagonal once. Sew to one end of a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" background rectangle (Q). Make 14 of each of the units shown below.



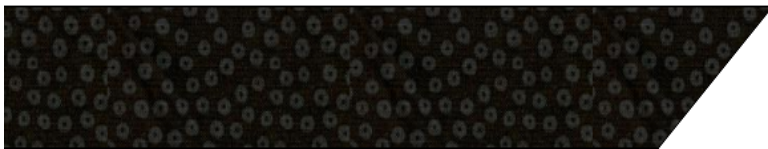
2. Cut the 2-7/8" border fabric squares (R) on the diagonal once. Sew a strip from Step one to one side of the triangles. Make 14 of each of the units shown below.



3. Cut the ends of the 1-1/2" x 5" black rectangles (S) at a 45 degree angle.

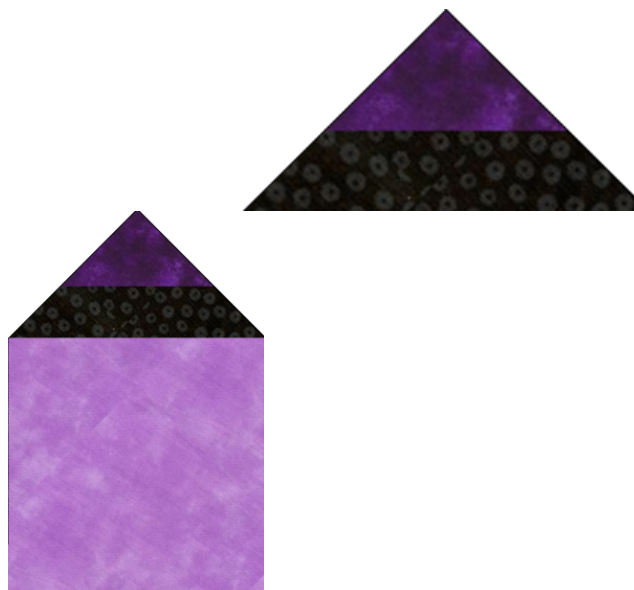

Sew these strips to the sides of the units from Step 2, paying attention to get the piece with the correct angle on the sections. Make 14 of each.



4. Cut the 3-1/4" border fabric square (T) on the diagonal twice so you have 4 triangles. Mark the center of the long edge of the triangle and the center of a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" black strip (U). Match the centers and sew together. Trim the edges of the black strip so it has a 45 degree angle.

5. Sew a unit from Step 4 to a 4-1/2" square of each of the four colors (V). Make one for each color.



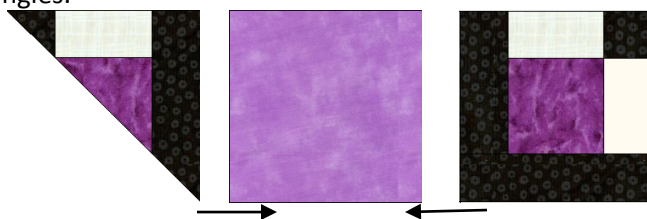
6. Sew a unit from Step 3 to each side of the four units from Step 5.



For Side Setting Triangles:

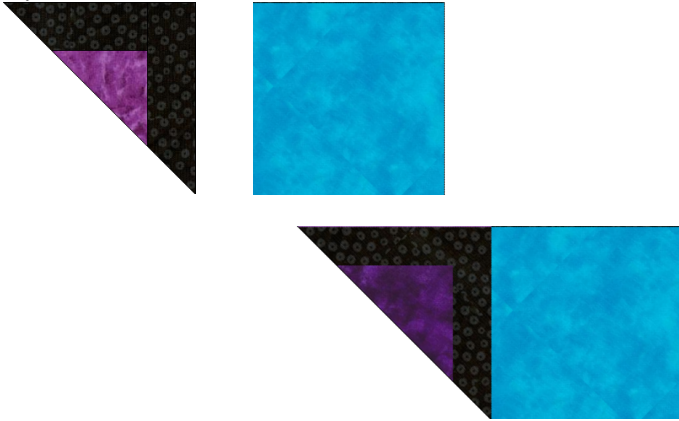


1. Pay very close attention to the color layout and be sure you get the pieces in the correct place. Using the sections from Step 3 of the Corner Triangles, and Step 5 of Block 1 instructions, make the side triangles.

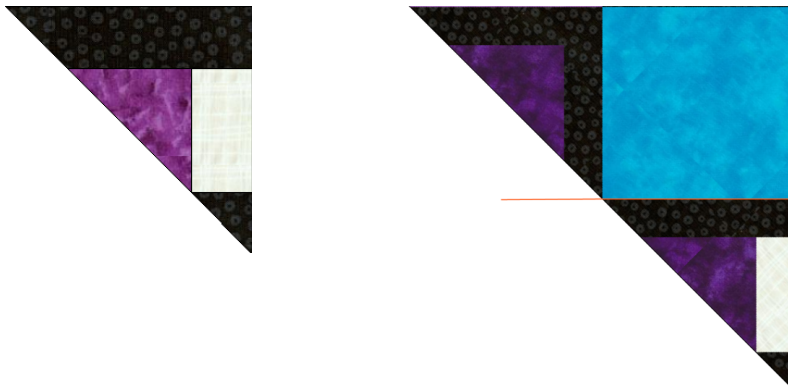




2. Cut 5 - 2-7/8" purple squares (W) on the diagonal once so you have 10 triangles. Sew a 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" black strip (F) to the short side of one of the triangles. Press and sew a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" (U) black strip to the remaining short side. Make 10. Refer to the Color Layout to see which 4-1/2" colored square should be used.



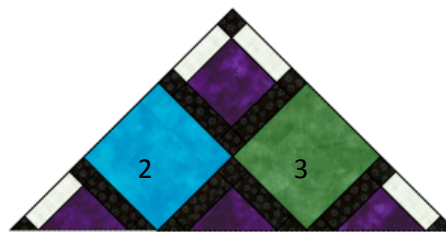
3. Use the section from Step 3 of the Corner Triangles.



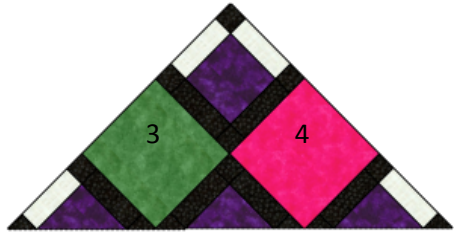
Make as follows:

Make 3 (Right Side)



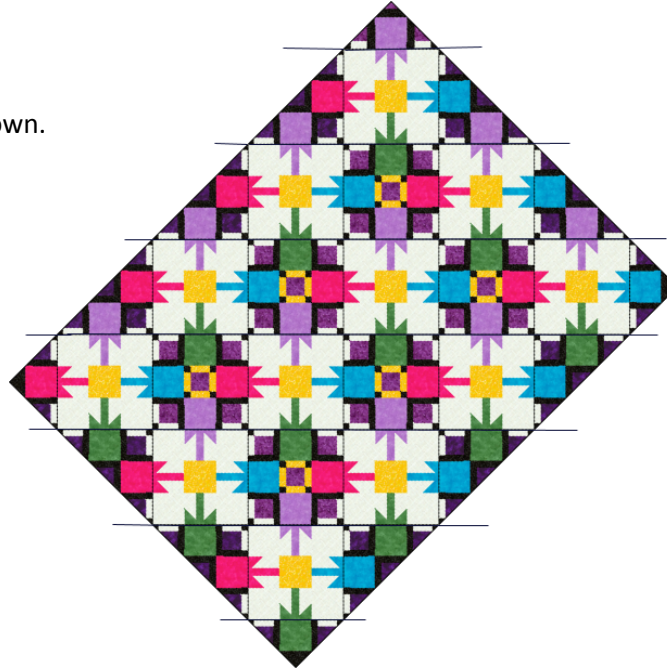
Make 2 (Bottom)

Quilt Assembly:

Sew the rows together as shown.

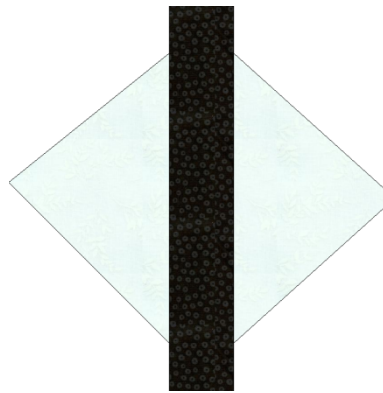


Pieced Border:

1. Cut the 34 background triangles (W) on the diagonal once so you have 68 triangles. Sew to black 1-1/2" strips (Y). You should be able to sew 5 background triangles per strip, leaving an inch or so between each triangle. The space is needed for squaring up.

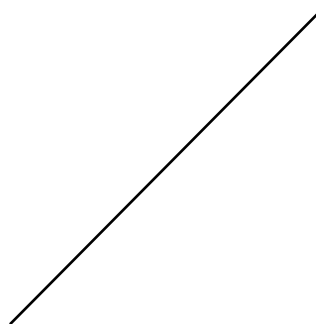


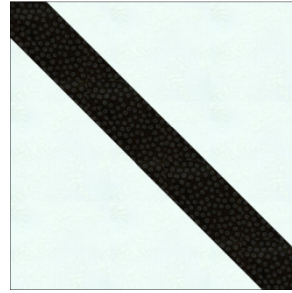
2. Cut apart. Sew background triangles to the other side to create units as shown. Make 36.



3. For **32** of the blocks, square to 4-7/8"; cut on the diagonal, across the black strip.

For **4** of the blocks (corners), square to 4-1/2" but **do not** cut on the diagonal at all.





4. Sew a unit from the above step to each side of a colored triangle (X).



Borders:



The top without borders should measure about 52-1/2" x 68-1/2". There are plenty of bias edges and if you experience any fullness, spread it across the length of the border and don't allow it to be bunched up in one spot. Carefully mark the center of the top and even the quarters if necessary.

All measurements are cutting measurements . . not finished measurements!

Border #1 – Border Fabric
Sides – 2" x 68-1/2" (B-1)
Top and Bottom – 1-3/4" x 54-1/2" (B-2)

Border #2 – Accent Fabric
Sides - 1-1/2" x 71" (B-3)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" (B-3)

Border #3 – Pieced Border

Border #4 – Accent Fabric
Sides – 1-1/2" x 80-1/2" (B-4)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 66-1/2" (B-4)

Border #5 – Border Fabric
Sides – 1-1/2" x 82-1/2" (B-5)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 68-1/2" (B-5)

Border #6 – Accent Fabric
Sides – 1-1/2" x 84-1/2" (B-6)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 70-1/2" (B-6)

Border #7 – Background Fabric
Sides – 2-1/2" x 86-1/2" (B-7)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 74-1/2" (B-7)

Border #8 – Accent Fabric
Sides – 1-1/2" x 90-1/2" (B-8)
Top and Bottom – 1-1/2" x 76-1/2" (B-8)

Border #9 – Border Fabric
Sides – 4-1/2" x 92-1/2" (B-9)
Top and Bottom – 4-1/2" x 84-1/2" (B-9)
